

Preface

The network cameras WV-SF135 series and WV-SF132 series are designed to operate using a PC on a network (10BASE-T/100BASE-TX).

By connecting to a network (LAN) or the Internet, images from the camera can be monitored on a PC via a network.

SF135

• Maximum image capture size (1280 x 960 (Aspect ratio of 4:3), 1280 x 720 (Aspect ratio of 16:9))

SF132

- Maximum image capture size (640 x 480 (Aspect ratio of 4:3), 640 x 320 (Aspect ratio of 16:9)) Note:
- It is necessary to configure the network settings of the PC and its network environment to monitor images from the camera on the PC. It is also necessary to install a web browser on the PC.

Main functions

H.264 and JPEG double encoding

The 2 types of H.264 stream outputs and the JPEG output can be simultaneously provided.

Power over Ethernet function

When connecting with a PoE (Power over Ethernet) device, power will be supplied by simply connecting a LAN cable. (IEEE802.3af compliant)

Adaptive darkness correction mode

Corrects the blacked-out parts of dark areas of objects that have different illumination intensities.



A dirty dome causes deterioration of picture quality.

Handle this camera with care.

Do not drop this camera, nor apply shock or vibration to this camera.

About the PC monitor

Displaying the same image on a monitor for a long time may damage the monitor. It is recommended to use a screen-saver.

When an error is detected, this product will restart automatically.

This product will be inoperable for around 2 minutes after the restart just as when the power is turned on.

Product disposal/transfer

Data saved on this product or a storage device used with this product may lead to personal information leakage.

When it is necessary to dispose or give this product to someone, even when for repair, make sure that there is no data on this product.

Cleaning this product body

Be sure to turn off the power before cleaning. Do not use strong abrasive detergent when cleaning this camera. Otherwise, it may cause discoloration.

Cleaning the lens

Use a lens cleaning paper (used to clean camera lenses or lenses of spectacles). When using solvent, use an alcohols solvent and do not use a thinner or a glass cleaner.

Transmission interval

Image transmission interval may become slow depending on the network environment, PC performance, shooting subject, access number, etc.

Code label

The code labels (accessory) are required at inquiry for trouble. Use caution not to lose these labels. It is recommended to paste one of the labels onto the CD-ROM case.

About the MOS image sensor

- When continuously shooting a bright light source such as a spotlight, the color filter of the MOS image sensor may have deteriorated and it may cause discoloration. Even when changing the fixed shooting direction after continuously shooting a spotlight for a certain period, the discoloration may remain.
- When shooting fast-moving subjects or performing panning/tilting operations, objects crossing the shooting area may look to be bending askew.

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Flickering

Due to the influence of lighting, flickering may sometimes happen. In this case, select "Indoor scene" for "Light control mode". Select "Indoor scene(50Hz)" or "Indoor scene(60Hz)" in accordance with the power supply frequency in your locality. Refer to the Operating Instructions (included in the CD-ROM) for further information about the setting. Under extremely strong lighting, flickering may happen even when "Indoor scene" is selected for "Light control mode".

When the brightness (illuminance) level on the screen is set to a relatively low level with the [Brightness] buttons, flickering may frequently happen. In such cases, either of the following can reduce flickering.

- Moderate the illumination intensities of objects by changing the camera direction.
- Set the brightness (illuminance) level on the screen to a brighter level with the [Brightness] buttons.

White-out on images caused by the effect of light control mode

When "Indoor scene" is selected for "Light control mode", the tone of the brighter parts on the screen may be deteriorated than the case when "ELC" is selected.

Color blurring on detailed drawing patterns

When there are detailed drawing patterns on images, color blurring may happen over these parts.

White dot noise

When the brightness levels of objects are too low, white dot noise may appear on the screen.

Panasonic assumes no responsibility for injuries or property damage resulting from failures arising out of improper installation or operation inconsistent with this documentation.

This camera is designed to be used indoors.

This product is not operable outdoors.

Do not expose this camera to direct sunlight for hours and do not install the product near a heater or an air conditioner. Otherwise, it may cause deformation, discoloration and malfunction. Keep this camera away from water and moisture.

Installing place

Do not place this product in the following places:

- Locations where it may get wet from rain or water splash
- Locations where a chemical agent is used such as a swimming pool
- Locations subject to humidity, dust, steam and oil smoke
- Locations in a specific environment where a solvent or a flammable atmosphere exists
- Locations where a radiation, an X-ray, a strong radio wave or a strong magnetic field is generated
- Locations where corrosive gas is produced, Locations where it may be damaged by briny air such as seashores
- Locations where the temperature is not within 0 °C to +40 °C {32 °F to 104 °F}.
- Locations subject to vibrations that exceed the railway specifications (EN50155)
- Locations subject to condensation as the result of severe changes in temperature (In case of installing the camera in such locations, the dome may become foggy or condensation may be caused on the cover.)

Be sure to remove this product if it is not in use.

Before installation

- When this camera is mounted on a ceiling or a wall, use the screws described on page 16. The screws to be used are not provided. Prepare the screws according to the material, structure, strength and other factors of the mounting area and the total weight of objects to be mounted.
- Ensure that the mounting surface, anchor and screws are sufficiently strong.
- Do not mount this product on a plaster board or a wooden section because they are too weak. If this product is unavoidably mounted on such a section, the section shall be sufficiently reinforced.

Design and engineer the power supply system to turn on/off the power of this product.

The product has no power switch. When installing the product, use a PoE hub equipped with the ON-OFF switch for servicing.

About the network connection

When connecting to a network using the network cable of this product, observe the following.

- When wiring for the network, design and engineer to not to be affected by thunder.
- It is impossible to install this product in combination with a pan/tilt head.

Screw tightening

- The screws and bolts must be tightened with an appropriate tightening torque according to the material and strength of the installation area.
- Do not use an impact driver. Use of an impact driver may damage the screws or cause tightening excessively.
- When a screw is tightened, make the screw at a right angle to the surface. After tightening the screws or bolts, perform visual check to ensure tightening is enough and there is no backlash.

Procure fixing screws separately.

The screws that secure this product are not supplied. Prepare them according to the material and strength of the area where the product is to be installed.

Do not remove or loosen the internal camera screws

Do not loosen the internal camera screws. Otherwise, the camera may malfunction, or fall, resulting in injury.

Radio disturbance

When this product is used near TV/radio antenna, strong electric field or magnetic field (near a motor, a transformer or a power line), images may be distorted and noise sound may be produced.

PoE (Power over Ethernet)

Use a PoE hub/device that is compliant with IEEE802.3af standard.

Router

When connecting this product to the Internet, use a broadband router with the port forwarding function (NAT, IP masquerade).



<Front view>




About the initial set button

After turning off the power of the camera, turn on the power of the camera while holding down this button, and wait for around 5 seconds or more without releasing this button. Wait around 2 minutes after releasing the button. The camera will start up and the settings including the network settings will be initialized. Do not turn off the power of the camera during the process of initialization. Before initializing the settings, it is recommended to write down the settings in advance.


Removing the dome cover base

Important:

· Remove the cover film from the dome section of the dome cover after the installation is complete. Do not touch the dome section by hand directly after removing the cover film.




1 Use a slotted head screwdriver to open the screw covers (2 places), and then loosen the 2 screws (M3).






2 Remove the dome cover.

• Hold both sides of the cover, release the hook and remove the dome cover.





You can install the camera on a ceiling or a wall. (187 Pages 16 and 17)

Important:


- Procure 3 screws (M4) to secure the camera to a ceiling or a wall, according to the material of the installation area. In this case, wood screws and nails should not be used. For mounting a camera on a concrete ceiling, use an anchor bolt (for M4) or an AY plug bolt (M4) for securing. (Recommended tightening torque: 1.6 N·m {1.18 lbf·ft})
- Required pull-out capacity of a single screw/bolt is 196 N {44 lbf} or more.
- If a ceiling board such as plaster board is too weak to support the total weight, the area shall be sufficiently reinforced.



Using the side cable access hole

When installing the camera directly on the ceiling or wall with cables exposed, cut out a portion of the dome cover to open a cable access hole.



Side cable access hole




Method of camera installation

Installing the camera directly on the ceiling or wall

Note:

- Use the installation template label (accessory) with the side with the arrow facing you.
- Ceiling installation:
- Place the installation template label so that the "¹," is pointing to the front of the camera (the lens side). • Wall installation:
- Place the installation template label so that the " \mathcal{J} " is pointing down.



<Connecting the cable through holes opened in the ceiling or wall>


Place the installation template label (accessory) on the ceiling or wall, mark the hole for the cable to be passed through and for the fixing screws (3 places), then open the holes.

Remove the installation template label, and mount the camera with 3 fixing screws (locally procured). (represent Page 20)

<Connecting the cable through the side cable access hole>

Place the installation template label (accessory) on the ceiling or wall, mark the holes for the fixing screws (3 places), then open the holes.

Remove the installation template label, and mount the camera with 3 fixing screws (locally procured). (INP Page 20)




Connection

Before starting the connection, turn off the power of the devices to be connected. Check and prepare the required devices and cables for connection.


Note:

 Since the connector storage section does not have a sufficient space, use a LAN cable that does not exceed the sizes described in the illustrations.



1 Connect a LAN cable (category 5 or better, straight) between a PoE device (such as a hub) and the network connector of the camera.


Network connector



Important:

- Use all 4 pairs (8 pins) of the LAN cable.
- The maximum cable length is 100 m {328 feet}.
- Make sure that the PoE device in use is compliant with IEEE802.3af standard.
- When disconnecting the LAN cable once, reconnect the cable after around 2 seconds. When the cable is quickly connected, the power may not be supplied from the PoE device.

Camera mounting

Installation shall be conducted after turning off each device.



1 Remove the dome cover. (R Page 15)




2 Connect the cables to the camera. (See Pages 18 and 19)

3 Fix the camera with 3 screws (M4) (locally procured).

Important:


- Do not touch the lens.
- When tightening the screws, be careful to ensure that the cables does not tangle the cables.

Adjustment

1 Adjust the camera angle.

When determining the camera angle, repeat fine adjustments by gradually moving the panning table and tilting table.

- Attach the lens adjuster (accessory) to the lens and adjust the direction of the lens. Attach the wider end of the lens adjuster to the lens.
- Do not touch the lens with your hand when making adjustments.
- Make adjustments to the direction of the lens while confirming the picture displayed on computer's monitor.



• When adjusting the horizontal angle of cameras mounted to a ceiling, adjust the direction of the lens by moving the lens holding the indentations on the sides of the lens.




Note:

- Depending on the vertical/horizontal angle used, the edges of the camera may be projected.
- Use Extra Zoom when you want to adjust the angular field of view on the "Tele" side. When VGA or a lower resolution is selected, the angular field of view can be adjusted without deterioration in the image quality. SF135


2 <Adjusting the focus of the lens>

Attach the lens adjuster (accessory), and rotate the lens to adjust the focus of the lens.

• When making adjustments to the focus of the lens, attach the narrower end of the lens adjuster to the lens.



When attaching or removing the lens adjuster, squeeze the wider end of the lens adjuster as shown in the illustration to open the narrower end of the lens adjuster.



• When the focus is difficult to adjust, set the [Zoom] button on the "Live" page to "x2".

Attaching the dome cover

1 Attach the dome cover to the camera with 2 dome cover fixing screws (M3) and the hook.



3 Remove the cover film completely.

Important:

- When attaching the dome cover the focus may be slightly disturbed. If this occurs, remove the dome cover and make the necessary adjustments.
- Before attaching the dome cover, make sure that the subject is present.
- Securely tighten all the fixing screws (x2) of dome cover. Otherwise, the camera may malfunction, or the dome cover may fall, resulting in injury.
- (Recommended tightening torque: 0.4 N·m {0.3 lbf·ft})
- Remove the cover film from the dome.
